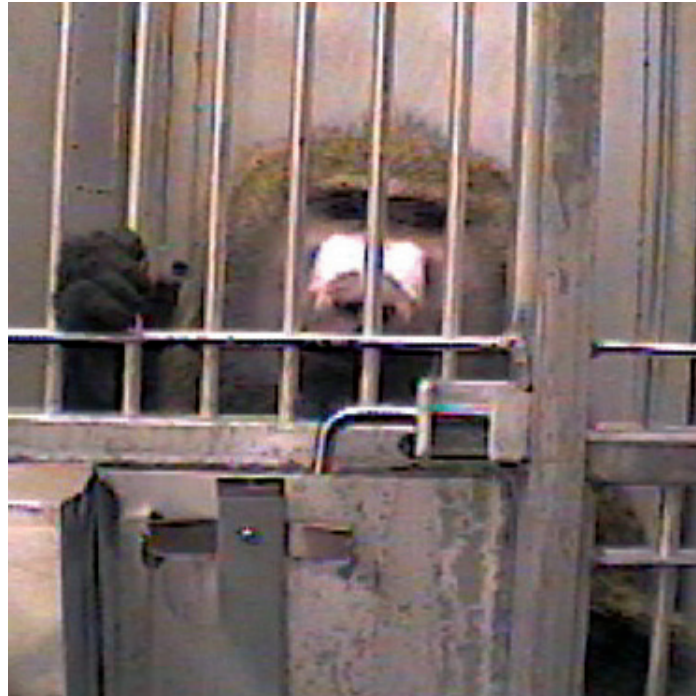


~ In Loving Memory ~



Baboon B777 of Columbia University died alone in his cage on September 21, 2001.

B777's left eye was cut out, a blood vessel in his brain was clamped, and a stroke was induced by an experimenter at Columbia University—all without adequate painkillers. His life ended in pain—vomiting in the barren metal cage that was his lonely home, unable to drink, eat, or even lift his head. Suffering for two days without pain medication or veterinary care, his death—like his life—was characterized by isolation, neglect, and misery.

B777 is survived by other sensitive primates whose heads have been implanted with metal pipes and whose flesh has been cut open with scalpels, as well as by experimenters at Columbia University who perform pointless, gruesome mutilations. **Please tell Columbia to end the cruelty.
